Before coming to the University in 1997, she worked for 20 years as a professional social worker in the fields of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Child Protection and Juvenile Delinquency. She has been supervisor of long and short term clinical social work with sexually abused and children in care, and consultant to mental health and probation service practitioners, and to teaching staff in general and special education.

She was the founder and the coordinator of the M.Sc. in "Social Policy and Social Work" (2009-2016), and since 2004 she is the director of the *Laboratory of Social and Community Work and Counselling* and the coordinator of the *Welcome Centre of the first year students* (both at the Democritus University of Thrace).

She has taught under and postgraduate courses on: Social Work Theory, Clinical Social Work, Child Protection, Social Work in the mental health and education sector, Assessment in social work practice, and Anti-oppressive Social Work. Since 2002 she has been supervising doctoral students at the Democritus University of Thrace, six of whom have completed their thesis on a range of Social Work-related subjects.

The academic year 2017-2018 she was visiting professor at the Department of Social Work in the University of Edinburgh.

She has implemented the TEMPUS program "Modernizing Russia Social Work Education and Teaching" (2009-2012) in Medical State University of Kazan, State University of Nizhny Novgorod and in the State Technical University of Saratov in collaboration with Lincoln University (Great Britain) και Siegen (Germany). Between 2004-2013, she participated to the joint intensive Socrates/Erasmus programme in "European Social Policy" in collaboration with eight European Universities (Umea University, the Catholic University of Lisbon, Univ. of Antwerp, Fribourg Univ. and the University of Sofia). Also she collaborates with the Hochschule for Soziale Arbeit of the Fachhochschule Nordwestschweiz in Basel.

She was the co-ordinator of the action 'Supporting Minority pupils with specific problems' within the EU co-financed project "Education of the Muslim Minority Children in Thrace" (2005-2007 and 2010-2014) implemented in seven certain deprived Muslim-Roma communities in Thrace (www.museduc.gr).

Research interests:

Her interests focus on applications, research and supervision of clinical practice (trauma, mourning, crisis situations) and child protection, on cultural diversity in education and mental health and on qualitative research methods. From 2012 her research focuses on the impacts of the austerity policies on children and families and on meeting the needs of the unaccompanied minors, refugee women, as well as in the impact of the socio-economic crisis on social work practice. Her follow up research focuses on individuals with developmental pervasive disorders, and on those with experience of a psychotic episode during their adolescence, and on the adult life of children who have grew up in foster care and in marginalized communities.

Her recent research activity includes join-university research projects, on 'Local community responses to marginalisation in Europe' (GB, Denmark, Portugal, Poland, Czech Republic), "RE-examining Social Work Education with migrants and refugees in the Balkans" (Croatia, Albania, Kosovo, North Macedonia, Bulgaria, Bosnia, Slovenia), "Recent newspapers representation of refugees and their social workers in Europe: a four countries comparison" (GB, Italy, Slovenia and Greece).

From 2018, she runs the project, *Social Work with Refugees and Migrants; Learning from comparative perspectives, Greece, Italy, Slovenia and UK*, (BASW- IC, IAT, and the University of Hertfordshire).
